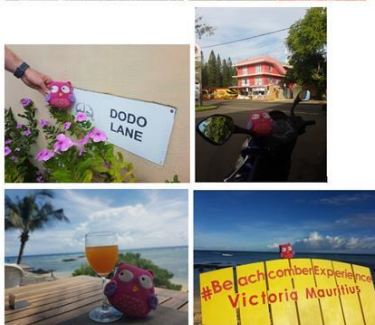


OLIVER'S TRAVELS

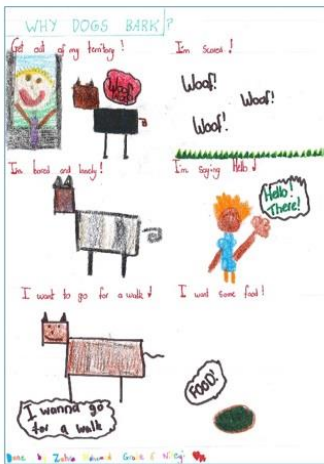
