Leah, Olivia and Mea each won different competitions that they took part in over the weekend, and won some lovely milkshakes.

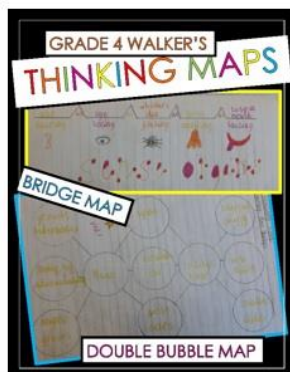
They climbed trees, played board games and ran around like happy, free children. They got to see some snow on the mountains in the distance too!

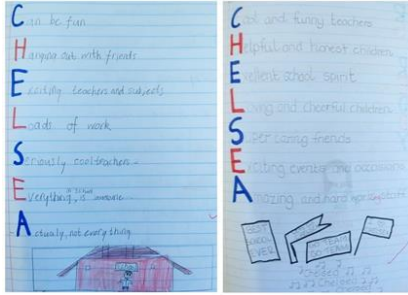
## Thinking Maps
